YPT IS A NATIONAL IMPERATIVE

- Youth Protection training is required for all BSA registered volunteers and is a joining requirement.
- Youth Protection training must be taken every two years. If a volunteer's
 Youth Protection training record is not current at the time of recharter, the
 volunteer will not be re-registered.
- To take Youth Protection training go to My.Scouting.org and create an account. You'll receive an email notification with your account information, including a member ID/reference number.
- From the My.Scouting.org portal, click Menu then My Dashboard from the menu list. The My Training page displays to take Youth Protection training. Upon completion, you may print a training certificate to submit with a volunteer application.
- When your volunteer application is approved, you will receive a BSA membership card that includes your member ID number.





GLAAC REQUIRES ALL ADULT VOLUNTEERS TO UNDERGO YPT TRAINING ANNUALLY

- GLAAC believes that annual YPT training helps reinforce the need to protect at all times.
- GLAAC requires that all registered adults have a nonexpired YPT certificate at the time of rechartering no earlier than 1 prior year (i.e., December 1, 2019 for December 1, 2020 rechartering).
- The YPT certificates for all registered adults must be included in the rechartering submittal to GLAAC.





YPT WORKAROUND USING PRIVATE BROWSING


- GLAAC recognizes that technical difficulties with my.scouting.org have created problems completing YPT training annually.
- A workaround has been investigated and verified for Window 10 PCs using Firefox and Google Chrome.
- The workaround is easy and does permit the registered adult to complete YPT training and receive the requisite valid YPT Certificate for 2020.
- The private browsing feature of other web browsers should also work (i.e., MS Edge, Apple Safari).

- Open a new Private
 Window from the Firefox

- Click the menu button
 Menu and then click New
 Private Window.
- The Private Browsing home page will open in a new window.











FIREFOX PRIVATE BROWSING



- Within the Private Browsing tab, go to <u>www.my.scouting.org</u> and log into your Scout Account.
- Click on Youth Protection Training and redo your 4 training modules.
- You must complete YPT within the Private Browsing Tab.



INCOGNITO MODE WITHIN GOOGLE CHROME



- On your computer, open Chrome.
- At the top right, click on the Menu Icon and then New Incognito Window.
- A new window appears.
 In the top corner, check for the Incognito bar and click it to open a new window.





- Within the Incognito tab, go to <u>www.my.scouting.org</u> and log into your Scout Account.
- Click on Youth Protection Training and redo your 4 training modules.
- You must complete YPT within the Incognito tab.





WORKAROUND NOTES

- You must redo each YPT module regardless whether it reports being completed previously. The National 2 year certification process is reflected on the YPT website, not GLAAC's mandate.
- You must complete all of the modules within the "private" or "incognito" browsing tabs. Otherwise, it will not record.

- Try to complete the YPT in one sitting without being logged out. The workaround has not been tested for breaks between modules.
- This has not been tested with non-Windows 10 PCs, Apple Computers or iPads/Tablets. However, Firefox and Chrome for Mac and non-Windows 10 PCs should work equally the same, YMMV.
